



## **ADJUTANT AND COMMANDANT GB U19 RIFLE TEAM**

### **INVITATION TO APPLY FOR THE ABOVE POSTS**

**Appointments' type.** Volunteer; reasonable and appropriate expenses paid.

**Duration of appointments.** Two consecutive tours – first as Adjutant and second as Commandant in order to provide essential continuity of in-country knowledge and awareness of the Republic of South Africa.

**Succession planning.** CCRS' intent is to identify candidates for the following: Adjutant 2020, Commandant and Adjutant for the years 2021, 2022 and 2023. Applicants will be asked to indicate the years for which they are available.

**Closing date for applications: 1700 hrs 21 Jun 19.**

1. **The Role.** The Council for Cadet Rifle Shooting (CCRS) promotes and organises the sport of target rifle shooting across the 4 cadet youth movements. CCRS' international activities includes selecting, training, launching and recovering 3 international teams – the UK Cadet Rifle Team (U17), the British Cadet Rifle Team (U18 and known as The Athelings) and the GB U19 Rifle Team. The role of the Commandant and Adjutant of the GB U19 Rifle Team is to contribute to the selection and training of the team and to lead the team to the Republic of South Africa (RSA). Both appointments report to Director GB U19 which is also a voluntary appointment. All 3 will be assisted and supported by the CCRS secretariat. Each tour lasts 3 weeks in Mar/Apr. This is an exciting opportunity for those who are passionate about contributing to the wider development of young people and helping them become responsible citizens.

2. **Deliverables.** Main tasks will be:

- a. Contribute to the selection of a squad of 14 to attend a training weekend in Oct/Nov of the preceding year of the tour.
- b. Following the training work with Director GB U19 to select team of 8 plus 2 non-traveling reserves.
- c. Lead the team for the period in RSA.
- d. Conduct a short lessons learned exercise with the Director following each tour.

3. **Required attributes/skills/knowledge.** Main requirements are:
- a. Adult member of one of the cadet youth movements; this is desirable as opposed to essential. Possess clean driving licence.
  - b. Possess the leadership ability to motivate and inspire young people.
  - c. Possess the personality and character to integrate easily into a successful team.
  - d. Intelligent, reliable and able to reach balanced decisions.
  - e. Experience of shooting and range work and working safely with rifles and ammunition.
  - f. Effective verbal and written communicator.
