## ADJUTANT AND COMMANDANT UK CADET RIFLE TEAM

## INVITATION TO APPLY FOR THE ABOVE POSTS

**Appointments' type.** Volunteer; volunteer allowance provided for period in Jersey.

**Duration of appointments.** Two consecutive tours – first as Adjutant and second as Commandant in order to provide continuity of in-country knowledge and awareness.

**Succession planning.** CCRS' intent is to identify candidates for the following: Adjutant 2020, Commandant and Adjutant for the years 2021, 2022 and 2023. Applicants will be asked to indicate the years for which they are available.

## Closing date for applications: 1700 hrs 30 Oct 19.

1. **The Role.** The Council for Cadet Rifle Shooting (CCRS) promotes and organises the sport of target rifle shooting across the 4 cadet youth movements. CCRS' international activities includes selecting, training, launching and recovering 3 international teams – the UK Cadet Rifle Team (U17), the British Cadet Rifle Team (U18 and known as The Athelings) and the GB U19 Rifle Team. The role of the Commandant and Adjutant of the UK Cadet Rifle Team (UKCRT) is to contribute to the selection and training of the team and to lead the team to Jersey. Both appointments report to Director UKCRT which is also a voluntary appointment. All 3 will be assisted and supported by the CCRS secretariat. Each tour lasts 9 days in August. This is an exciting opportunity for those who are passionate about contributing to the wider development of young people and helping them become responsible citizens.

2. **Deliverables.** Main tasks will be:

a. Contribute to the selection of a squad of 20 to attend Ex Maple Taste.

b. Attend Ex Maple Taste each Spring (26-29 Mar for 2020) to assist with squad training; work with Director UKCRT to select team of 12 plus 2 non-traveling reserves.

c. Be present during the latter half of Cadet Bisley to interact with staff and team members and begin building team spirit and cohesion.

d. Lead the team for the period in Jersey.

e. Conduct a short lessons learned exercise with the Director following each tour.

## 3. **Required attributes/skills/knowledge.** Main requirements are:

a. Adult member of one of the cadet youth movements.

b. Possess the leadership ability to motivate and inspire cadets.

c. Possess the personality and character to integrate easily into a successful team.

d. Intelligent, reliable and able to reach balanced decisions.

e. Experience of shooting and range work and working safely with rifles and ammunition.

f. Effective verbal and written communicator.
