## CCF 100 Smallbore Team Final 2023

- 1. Introduction.** After the introduction of the CCF 100 smallbore competition in 2021, CCRS will run a CCF 100 Smallbore Team Final in March/April 2023 as an enhancement to the 2022/2023 competition. This has been endorsed by the CCF Schools' Shooting Committee. This will initially follow a proven format of the Inter-Services Smallbore Final as shot by the Open Units. Dates of the match are to be confirmed.
- 2. Match Format.** This will be a shoulder-to-shoulder final that will take place at the Lord Roberts Centre, Bisley with approximately eight teams invited to compete. Each team of four will shoot two ten-bull cards at 25m and the highest combined team score will win. Teams of three will then conduct a 'Shell Match' as part of a separate knock out competition for a second trophy. The 'Shell Match' is shot as a team at small clay disks and is very similar to the Falling Plates Match in Service Rifle with the fastest team winning.
- 3. Qualification.** Qualification will run in-line with Round 1 of the CCF 100 Postal Competition. After entering online, teams will be sent individual stickers annotated with team numbers. These team stickers will be shot concurrently with the Round 1 Individual cards. Round 1 cards must be fired on or before 01 Dec 22. A copy of the CCF 100 Match Conditions are attached.
- 4. Eligibility.** All teams will be teams for four. Teams that are eligible to enter the CCF 100 will also be eligible to qualify for the CCF Smallbore Team Final according to the Match Conditions attached. Contingents may enter multiple teams of four.
- 5. Results.** Results will be published alongside Round 1 Individual results in Jan 23 and the top eight teams will be invited to the shoulder-to-shoulder final.
- 6. Postal Matches.** CCRS run many postal matches throughout the year and more information can be found in the CCRS Postal Matches Handbook:
