CCRS CADET FORCES .22 TEAM COMPETITION ('Country Life')
2022 Judge's report

Congratulations to this year's winners – Royal Grammar School Guildford CCF 2nd team, who counted out Bedford School CCF on the Landscape target and beat their first team by one point! The highest second team (not in the first three) was from Charterhouse CCF.

The highest Community Cadet team was 169 (St Blazey) Sqn RAFAC who headed a list of RAFAC teams, many from the West Country. There were several ACF teams, but unfortunately none from the Sea Cadets.

For a change, let's talk about admin first. I recognise that this competition makes a lot of demands on the admin skills of supervising officers, unit officers and cadets and I congratulate you all on the good shooting and relatively few errors this year! The new pink form meant that all units declared their range length and only a few entered estimated scores (Please don't!)

The labels on the front of the targets meant that virtually all targets had names on the front and the number of shots fired declared.

All units scored in the Grouping but there were not many full unit scores of 100 this year. Ability to group is of course a vital skill and should be practised as often as possible.

Then it is necessary to produce good groups at speed in the Rapid competition! Results here were pretty good with almost all managing to get 10 shots away in the extended time of 75 seconds. Congratulations to Sgt Hine of Bedford School, Cadet Cousins of Uppingham School and L/H Cowling of Charterhouse who scored the maximum 40.

Most units included snap backers (as instructed!) and this, plus the declaration of number of shots fired in the snap makes it easier for me to adjudicate in your favour when shots are close together. (The number of shots fired should be based on any live rounds returned during the clearance procedure, not the number of hits seen.) Cadet Myers of Guildford, Sgt Lumley-Wood of Bedford and Cdt Taylor of Uppingham were the only ones to score the maximum 30 – well done! (Note that the circle on target is a relic from the past and is not used in current scoring!)

Individual scores in the first three series were lower this year, with no scores of 95 and with 94s only from Cdt Cousins of Uppingham School and L/H Cowling of Charterhouse. I hope top shooters will go for the elusive 95 next year!

The Landscape is, of course, the crucial feature of this competition and, once again, a few teams who had done really well on the first three series found difficulty here. From years ago when I ran a unit team, I know how difficult it is, when practising, to direct firers onto the circles. Many of you did it very well, with the right-hand objective proving the most difficult.

Well done to you all and good shooting in the Summer!
