**CCRS CADET FORCES .22 TEAM COMPETITION ('Country Life')**  
**2024 Judge's report**

There were a few more entries this year, compared with last, but, regrettably, fewer from Community Cadet teams. Royal Grammar School, Guildford rather swept the board, with their 1st team winning the Cup, their 3rd team coming third and their second team winning the '2nd team' competition. Congratulations to them and to Charterhouse 1st team who came second with a really good score in the first three series being let down by the right-hand objective on the Landscape target. 45F (Worthing) Sqn ATC were the highest Community Cadet team and their Cadet Macrae was the highest Community cadet. Well done to them.

There are signs that teams are getting to grips with the new Cadet .22 rifle. There were many more scores of 100 in the Grouping which is heartening. The second year of the extended time limit for the Rapid meant that most firers got off ten well-aimed shots and scoring on the snap targets was often good.

The Landscape provided the usual challenge to Leaders and firers alike. Ampleforth College 2nd team scored a magnificent 111, but other scores over 100 were rare, just RGS Guildford 3rd team and Sutton Valence 1st team scoring 101. Well done to them all. The objective by the small 'fortress' in the centre seemed to cause the most problems.

Once again, admin proved a problem in some cases. The use of labels on the front of targets meant that I could easily identify who had fired it and how many shots had been fired. Almost all the snap targets had backers (a reversed single bull target does nicely) so thank you for sending them. Most units had identified the range length and only a very few had erroneously filled in estimated scores. Please note that there is no need to send the Landscape target in a tube - just fold it up with the other targets and send it in a large envelope. Other targets forced down a tube are a pain to extract! I know that the rules are strange and complicated, so congratulations to the Officers i/c and the Supervising Officers who got things right! I hope the cadets enjoyed this unusual shoot once again.
